Wallboard that bends can really help in rooms with "soft" corners. National Gypsum Company's 1/4-inch High-Flex Wallboard is typically double-layered and can handle a 15-inch-radius bend when dry. Wet it down with a water-soaked paint roller and you can get a 7-inch-radius bend. High-Flex comes in the standard 4-foot width and lengths of 8, 9, 10, and 12 feet.

Painter's Sandpaper



When used on surfaces painted with water-based paints, sandpaper typically "loads" quickly. This means that the grit gets clogged with the chips it has rubbed off and it can't cut any more. 3M's Professional Painters' Abrasive has an antiload coating that keeps the chips from filling up the aluminum oxide grit. #### **Toilet Elevator**



One of the really tough jobs for a one-person crew is pulling or setting a toilet. It's easier if you take the tank off first, but that makes the job take a lot longer, too. The *Johnny-Lift* from Roll-Lift Corp. might be a good alternative. Once it's clamped onto the bowl, the crank can lift a toilet 10 inches off the floor. The Johnny-Lift is just 19<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches wide when assembled and breaks down easily into three pieces. It sells for around \$280.

## Air Intake

A plumbing system needs to pull air in through the vent stack when water drains out the waste line. In a big



house with drains far apart, you usually either need to run a long pipe to the main vent or pop a second vent stack through the roof. Now the *Durgo Air Admittance Valve* lets you terminate a vent in the attic, inside a hollow wall with a grille to room air, or inside a sink cabinet. Since air can only flow one way through the valve, no sewer gases can escape. Durgo comes in two diameters: 1½ and 3 inches. It's approved by ASSE, BOCA, CABO, and a few others.

### New Workstation



The *TracMaster* workstation was designed by a former shipbuilder who was not impressed by the products on the market. The TracMaster comes with a tool mount that fits most chop saws, an adjustable work support, and a sliding stop. The system retails for about \$300.
